We grew in strength and in numbers both students and staff and of course the community. Today we stand at a crossroad of expansion, a dream that is tangible and real, yet so far and surreal with a mammoth task ahead of us.

Yes, I am speaking of the future building of the school -a vision of a new building, the hard work, the new economics that would come into play, for this dream to become a reality. It's time now to awaken the 'Sleeping will', of the old and the new community members of Advaya Shaale. How apt are the above lines of Rudolf Steiner! Its time to take hold of the weaving forces, its time to take hold of the growth forces for the sake of the children of Advaya - for the now and the future children. I urge each parent and student to Meditate on the above lines and abide by the light and shine forth.

Most Anthroposophical founders of Institutions are inspired by a 'moral Intuition' says Coenraad Houten. Something wants to come down, wants to live, wants to be. This must be given a form – a spirit structure. This form of the Institution is now a 'Being' that of Advaya Shaale; existing in its three fold aspect of Thinking, Feeling and Willing.

It exists through the trinity of the Institution comprising of: The teachers and the management staff, The parents and then The students. Rudolf Steiner talks of the three-fold social order... the trinity mentioned above is interdependent and only the awakening of the social will of the people involved will bring about an evolution for the 'Being 'of Advaya Shaale.

We all know of evolution of the individual Being through the seven foldedness. The spirit structure of Advaya has seen through the Will forces, it has been nourished through the birth of the etheric forces that means the first step in the process of incarnation is complete.

This spirit structure has to move into the second stage of development – that of soul development. The Being of Advaya goes through a constant process of incarnation, growth and development. This is expressed through the ideas and values living in the staff and the students and in the internal structure, thus we find the trinity of three interdependent bodies becoming an organic whole form. The Being of Advaya is all set for a new organizational growth similar to that of a three-fold human being.

The school in a sense is ready to meet the outside world. The impetus for healthy growth of the school comes from a collective awareness of the whole community to re-envision the school, its expansion to bring in a new social order, to see that the pioneering children get to fully experience the Waldorf philosophy and bring about a transformation in the social and cultural realms of society, as future beacons of the society. We are at a transitional phase that could become a transformational phase only if there is a systematic breakdown in the organizational structure for a healthy development of the school as a living entity.

The contribution of every parent to this developmental process is crucial and can be transformative.

This task can be achieved through conscious working at the societal level by the community finding ways to engage in the economic, financial and physical and human resources.

Steiner hoped for the first Waldorf school to engage the economic sphere in forming collaborative relationships that support education. In today's world we expect and hope to create an essential source of funds for the school's operation. Volunteers for the three realms collection of the fund,(nerve sense system) disbursing and management of the fund (rhythmic system) and the limbic system with responsibility of governance of the school, all require an army of people. Just like in the Treta yuga the army of squirrels aided the building of the Bridge over the ocean, so too does Advaya Shaale need every force, every bit of energy from the community big or small to make this developmental process a reality. There is no eligibility criteria for engaging in this. The one chance of Being the change that you always wanted to be is here, let's rise up and take this on as a community.

A high school for our Advaya children and a transforming education system is what we have to dream about, meditate on and work towards.

Grade 6 (Mar '22)- Visit To Belum Caves

Rocks are individuals, just like students. Each one is unique and special, and not at all easy to understand, birthed through a process that is both miraculous and mysterious. In our Geology block we studied that each type of rock contained characteristic minerals, and that rocks are being created and recycled all the time through a "rock cycle" of sorts.

This study included a trip to Belum Caves in Kurnool Andhra Pradesh. It was indeed a wonderful way to end the academic year for Grade 6 when we visited the Limestone caves and saw the stalactite limestone formations. It was a $5\frac{1}{2}$ hour journey covering a distance of 300km.

It was a very enriching experience for all of us to go about 200m below the ground and explore the caves which were quite big. We were all perspiring profusely in the caves though it was not hot!

We got to see the force of water which had etched its marks on the hard rocks.

The class spent a lot of time together and these experiences of social bonding and personal growth accompanied a growing appreciation and respect within the children for the greater forces at work in nature, and also in their lives.









Clay work and it's Relevance

At Advaya Shaale we begin working with Clay in a formal manner from Grade 3. Clay modelling is a highly immersive activity and gives us the opportunity to integrate our willing, feeling and thinking. It allows us to develop artistic value and children learn to work with the 3 dimensional form. Handling clay and sometimes even struggling with the material helps develop and strengthen our emotional intelligence. Clay as a medium allows us to meet the outer world through inner activity while handling external earth material.

Teacher Training for G6 & G7

She has more than 20 years of experience in teaching and has been a Class teacher and Middle school teacher for more than 12 years at Abhaya, Hyderabad.

She is also the Indian ambassador in the International Waldorf School's Forum.

We are very fortunate to work under her able guidance.

She has been our mentor since last year. However this year it was wonderful to have her training in person at Advaya Shaale.

Many teachers from other Waldorf schools also participated. It was a 10 day long intensive training for Grades 6&7.

We started with the overview of each grade. The curriculum and the physiological development of the child in each grade and how the curriculum complimented the growth and provided balance and harmony which are the key factors in education to lead to developing free thinking individuals was at the core of this training.

We were given a glimpse of how each subject would give nourishment to the growing children. We were in awe of how each and every subject in the Grades worked with the Thinking ,Feeling and Willing / Head ,heart and hands. It was wonderful to experience how science like Physics and Chemistry would unfold in the classroom.

The most important aspects of Waldorf education was touched upon beautifully in the way our day during the training was planned with breathing in and out woven with music ,speech and movement followed by intensive Steiner text reading to understand the 'whys' and 'hows' of each lesson & how it must transcend in the classroom.

We then looked at the curriculum and practical ways to teach the concepts in the classroom after which we would enter into the realm of art (charcoal, veil painting or perspective

drawings) and let the day's learning sink in!









Teacher Training for G1 to G5

A four day workshop was conducted by Shailaja teacher for grades 1-5. The workshop was hosted by Advaya Shaale, where teachers from several Waldorf schools attended the sessions.

The workshop imparted a clear understanding of the consciousness of the child, how a well designed Waldorf curriculum would support the changing consciousness of each child and how to take the curriculum to class effectively.

During the sessions, many activities were conducted in detail. Verses and songs relevant to each grades were practiced. The rhythmical spatial exercises were experienced through Bothmer stick activities. Teachers also practiced Form drawing, which creates an awakening effect through spatial orientation and awareness of body geography. Black Board drawing, which improves the creativity and imagination of children was rehearsed. Many group activities relevant to the each grade were comprehensively dealt with.

The Workshop proved to be a vivid and practical learning experience to all participants. In addition to the above mentioned activities, the workshop also integrated important aspects of storytelling, rhythmic movement, visual arts and music.

It was also wonderful to interact with teachers from other Waldorf Schools in India. On the whole, the workshop provided each participant a holistic, integrative and a joyful experience.









Summer Bazaar

At the beginning of this academic year, as we were trying to put together the calendar of events, we felt the need to first have one large event and then branch into smaller focused ones. The world around him burned.


None played a turne

He plushed his strings


while an emprive grinds to dust.
